The Book of Esther is one of the Jewish people's favorites. In this eight-program television series, Dr. Jeffrey Seif explains its details, and points out that, like Esther herself, we Believers may be alive *for such a time as this.*

Beautiful Inside and Out Does God use women? Yes, He does! We begin by considering Esther's rise and wicked Queen Vashti's demise, and note how God elevates individuals to places of influence—then as now.

Chosen for a Purpose Though wickedness surfaces in various ways in every generation, God positions His people to thwart the devil's plans and fulfill His own. Here, we examine Mordecai and Esther's placement—and our own; for we, too, are called to God's work.

Called to be Courageous Faced with a plot to destroy the Jews, Esther wavers but decides her sacrifice is worth it, and declares, "If I perish, I perish!" Would that we all had such resolve!


Undone by a Woman Unbeknownst to the scheming Haman, our story's courageous heroine hatches her own plan to thwart him. The once-sheepish Esther stands up as a shepherdess. She boldly takes on the wolf, thus guiding the saga to its peaceful conclusion.

SAR SHALOM (Prince of Peace) Eight 30-minute TV programs on two DVDs #DSAR, \$49

Explore what it means to walk in the footsteps of Israel's Messiah. Jeff's passage-by-passage exposition of Jesus' principal teachings comes to life through onlocation production with real-world re-enactments, all performed by Israelis.

Sermon on the Mount We consider the "Beatitudes" (Matt. 5:1–12), and unpack Jesus' exhortation that Believers be "salt of the earth" and "light of the world" (5:13–16).

Crimes of the Heart Matthew 5:17–20 leads us to consider how Jesus fulfills the Torah (Jewish Law). Murder begins in the heart (5:21–26), and adultery begins with desire (5:27–30).

The Law Brought to Life Jesus speaks about divorce and the marriage bond in 5:31–32, and other human bonds in 5:33–37. Verses 38–42 deal with "going the extra mile" and how to be gracious even toward the ungracious.


Models of Behavior Jesus teaches how to deal with enemies (5:43–48). In 6:1–4, He emphasizes doing good to please God and not men. His teachings on prayer follow in 6:5–15.

Eternal Investments Verses 16–18 note that fasting pays dividends. With verses 19–21, we consider the fact that laying up treasures on Earth, alone, does not. God wants Believers to be gracious, not greedy, per verses 22–23.

God's Material Provisions Jesus challenges followers to serve either God or possessions (6:24). Blessings abound to those who serve Him (6:25–34). Considering how blessed we forgiven ones are, we must not rush to judge others (Matthew 7:1–6).

God's Spiritual Provisions Matthew 7:7–12 addresses tenacity and God's benevolence in the Christian's life. The "narrow path" we must walk (7:13–14) is not the path chosen by the majority. Our "fruits" testify on our behalf; likewise, we can beware of those whose lifestyles and teachings stand as an indictment against them (7:15–20).

Yeshua—Foundation Sufficient for Salvation God works in spite of evildoers, not through them. Deception of self and others gives way to truth at Day's End (7:21–23). Jesus advises us to build our hope for salvation on the right foundation— Him (7:24–29). Jeff reviews the entire "Sermon on the Mount," and offers closing reflections.

THE DARK PRINCE: When The Devil Has His Day

In this made-for-TV miniseries, Dr. Jeffrey Seif takes readers through Bible texts that speak about the devil. Introductory in nature, *The Dark Prince* gives individuals a behind-thescenes look at Evil's workings at the ragged edge of human history, and its ultimate uprooting when Christ returns.

Satan's Rise and Demise in Genesis Though Genesis talks about the dawn of Creation and the good Earth that followed, it focuses on how Creation strayed and who is responsible. This series opener discusses Satan's emergence and God's plan to crush him when Satan arises to rule the world at the dusk of human history.

Satan in Biblical History This program pays attention to biblical history's bookends: the paradise lost story in Genesis, and the paradise restored story in Revelation. The lessons illustrating Satan's rise and demise should encourage people to position themselves on the right side of the battle line.

The Ruler of This World We follow along as Isaiah describes the "ruler of this world," Satan, through an actual ruler of the ancient world, and as Matthew relates how Satan once offered Jesus the kingdoms of this world. The temptations that the Lord avoided are ones that we should avoid, as well.


To Steal, Kill, and Destroy Out of Daniel's restless mind came images of unimaginable beasts that would wreak havoc upon a decaying world. Revelation uses the same images and picks up on the very same themes. This program examines these connections and their application to end-time Bible prophecy—and to today.

Deceit, Betrayal, and Coming Miseries The devil's principal tools—deceit and betrayal—were first noted in the Garden of Eden. We look at Jesus' agony and betrayal—also in a garden— and the flurry of miseries that will be unleashed on this planet before the garden paradise is restored, as promised in Revelation.

Armageddon and the Final Conflict Job's miseries mirror the world's in many ways, and result from Satan's agitations. The Bible gives ample evidence that Satan attacks individuals, and Revelation describes how his assaults culminate in the Battle of Armageddon.

The Collapse of an Intoxicated World The Bible informs readers that an intoxicated and disoriented last-days world will collapse and drown in its own depravity. Revelation tells this story, vividly relating how the world will lament the destruction of the evil prince of this world—a demise brought about by the Lord's return.

The Second Coming! We look at the long-anticipated return of Jesus and the consequent restoration of paradise.

A Messianic Prototype The New Testament refers to Jesus as the "Son of David"—with good reason. We examine how the Old Testament predicted a coming Davidic Son.



Messiah Messianic parallels abound in the person of David. In this closing program, we consider their various applications and implications. You'll walk away saying "He lives!" and, we hope, believing that He lives in you.

ZOLA'S HIGHLIGHTS: A Video Collection of Classic Zola

These programs celebrate the timeless teachings of the late Zola Levitt, one of the most beloved Bible teachers in America. Highlights from 30 years of television broadcasting are condensed into 4 half-hour programs that examine Zola's early, mid-career, and later teaching. On-location footage from Israel gives viewers insights into the biblical world and Word.

Israel, My Promised Zola taught the Scriptures from a decidedly Jewish perspective. In one of his first series, *Messiah*, Zola taught about Jesus' Jewish beginnings; in *Armageddon*, he talked about The End. This program contains these and more.

Israel By Divine Right Drawing on Zola's mid-career teachings, we see him investigate and extol the Gospel's expansion beyond Jews—to non-Jews. Though many knew Jesus as the Savior, Zola wanted the world to know Him as the *Jewish* Savior. This program offers samplings of this emphasis, and also delves into the Dead Sea Scrolls, introduces Islam, and considers prophecy.

Jerusalem Forever Zola's contagious love for Israel—which mimics the Scripture's—is apparent in his music, books, and TV productions. This program visits Zola in mid-career when he teaches about the Bible's Jewish roots, emphasizing his trademark subject: prophecy.


Friends of the Rabbi Viewer interest in how the Old Testament holy days connect to New Testament events made *The Holy Days* of *Our Lord* one of Zola's more popular series. Zola examined that connection by focusing on those who claimed to follow Jesus: early Believers, Crusaders, and others. The program concludes with an interview with author Tim LaHaye.

JEHOVAH'S TREASURE — The Quest for the Ark of the Covenant and Temple Treasures

Five years in the making and narrated by David Dolan, a longtime friend of ZLM and former Jerusalem reporter for CBS, *Jehovah's Treasure* uniquely documents the unearthing of two extraordinary tunnels in the Judean Desert. These tunnels were discovered after the Copper Scroll, one of the Dead Sea Scrolls, indicated that Temple treasures were buried all over Israel, some near the caves of Qumran where the Scrolls were discovered. Archaeologist Oren Gutfeld kindly permitted us to document three years of his excavations in tunnels that descend at a perfect 35° for 425 feet—tunnels dating back to the First Temple Period. Nowhere else in all of Israel has anyone found tunnels like these.


Thus, with interviews and dramatic re-enactments, *Jehovah's Treasure* presents the biblical account of the Ark and the Temple Treasures. At the same time, it uncovers the incredible mystery of tunnels that may lead to the very same treasures.

Is history finally about to unleash its most profound desert secrets? Will the Holy Treasures be revealed at the end of the Judean tunnels? Or will they remain a secret, buried deep within Jerusalem's politically contested Temple Mount?






